I want to emphasize the need for every member to become a recruiter for the CAF/DFW Wing. The CAF loses twice as many members each year as we sign up. At this rate we will soon be a *Static Museum*. Now is time for *you* to start recruiting. HQ has printed a wonderful brochure (see me for brochures) with a tear out application attached. It is very easy to carry and have available. It is a missed opportunity not to talk CAF with everyone you come in contact with. The application has a place for their credit card number and expiration date, your name and DFW Wing as the Unit they wish to join. Put your name, and DFW Wing in these spaces, and you and the Wing will get credit. HQ returns \$50. to the Wing in the form of a refund to ANNUAC payments if the applicant remains a member for 3 years. Have them fill it out in your pres-

ence and you mail it in for them. You will still have to use the old Wing application to sign them up for the Wing. You have to sell the membership while they are interested.
